Well-Paying Careers

Educators want to be able to direct their students toward meaningful career choices and employment. In Texas, occupations that require an Associate Degree or vocational certification pay an average of more than \$40,000 a year compared to the average pay of less than \$25,000 for those with only a high school diploma or less.

The shortage of skilled workers in the building industry is a major problem. 52% of home builders experienced a labor shortage in June 2015, up from 46% the previous year. Home building companies look forward to welcoming skilled graduates into the industry.

Scholarship Application Instructions

Several scholarship opportunities are available through the Texas Builders Foundation. Apply by completing the general application.

The Foundation will match your application to the scholarship opportunity for which you are qualified.

The auto-fill application can be found at www.TexasBuildersFoundation/what-we-do. (A sample of the application can be found later in this guidebook.)

Eligibility Requirements

1. The applicant must be enrolled for the fall semester as: a student in a Texas technical/trade school or community college/university that offers a building trade certification; or a construction science, management, engineering or related degree, and have at least one full academic year of course work remaining following the award of the scholarship.
2. The applicant must be pursuing a construction related trade certification or construction/engineering degree.
3. The applicant must demonstrate an interest in obtaining employment in the construction industry or a construction related field upon graduation.
4. Preference will be given to:
 - a. Applicants who are legal residents of Texas.
 - b. Students who plan to join Texas' construction workforce.
5. All portions of the application must be completed and submitted as one package. It is the responsibility of the applicant to ensure that all portions of the application are received by the deadline. Applications received after the April 29 deadline may not be considered.

Selection Criteria

Applicants are evaluated using the following criteria:

- Career goals
- Financial need
- Academic achievement
- Employment history
- Recommendations
- Extracurricular activities

Award Information

1. Individual scholarships will be awarded for the fall semester.
2. The application deadline is April 28.
3. Applications will be reviewed by the Board of Trustees and staff of the Texas Builders Foundation.
4. The Board of Trustees of the Texas Builders Foundation may request interviews with the applicants who are finalists for the scholarship awards.
5. Scholarships are distributed through the Texas Builders Foundation, and checks are made payable to and mailed directly to the school in which the student is enrolled for the fall semester.

6. Students may apply for additional scholarships for subsequent semesters until graduation. The award of an initial scholarship does not guarantee the award of an additional scholarship to the student.
7. Second semester awards are contingent upon the student maintaining full time status and good academic standing.
8. All selection decisions are final and are not subject to appeal.
9. Applications and supporting documents become the sole property of the Texas Builders Foundation and will not be returned.

Receipt Deadline – April 28

All materials must be received in one large manila envelope by April 29. Applications must include original signatures and will not be accepted via email or facsimile (FAX). Recommendation letters in their sealed envelopes and official transcripts must be included with the original application. Incomplete applications or applications received after the deadline may not be considered.

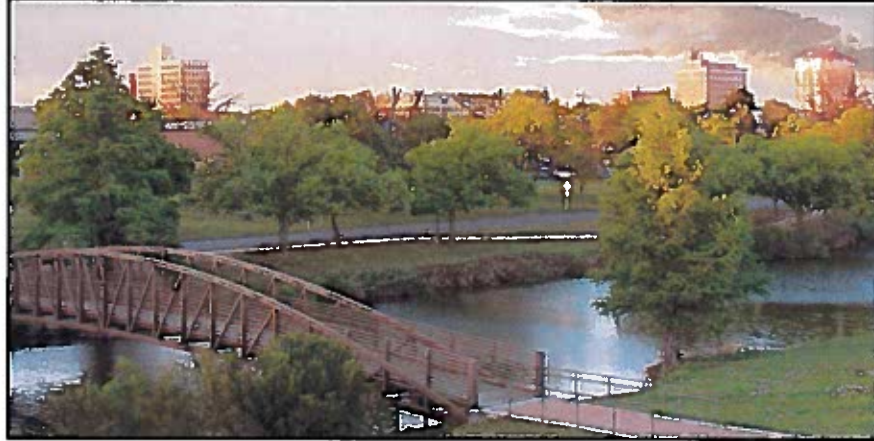
Through the generosity of these donors, each of whom contributed \$1,000, this endowment has reached funding of \$50,000 as of December 31, 2015 and will continue to grow.

Herman and Patsy Smith Charitable Foundation Endowment

Patsy Smith and her late husband, Herman Smith, are legends in the housing industry. Prior to his death, Mr. Smith served as president of Herman Smith & Company and worked to develop land throughout Tarrant County, Texas.  - a. Applicants who are legal residents of Texas.
 - b. Students who plan to join Texas' construction workforce.
6. All portions of the application must be completed and submitted as one package. It is the responsibility of the applicant to ensure that all portions of the application are **received** by the deadline. Applications received after the April 28, 2017 deadline may not be considered.

NOTE: Applications with fewer than three (3) recommendations will not be considered.

NOTE: Recommenders cannot be immediate family members.

All materials must be received in one large envelope by April 28, 2017. Applications must include original signatures and will not be accepted via email or facsimile (FAX). Recommendation letters in their sealed envelopes and official transcripts must be included with the original application. Incomplete applications or applications received after the deadline may not be considered.
